

Consular Fees Due to Increase

New Consular fees will be in effect worldwide starting on **Tuesday, July 13, 2010**.

Below are the new rates for some common services:

Visa Pages added to your passport are **no longer free** and will now cost US\$82. Click [here](#) to print out an application for additional pages.

Adult passport renewal will be US\$110. Click [here](#) to print out an application.

Minor passport (newborns and persons under the age of 16) will be US\$105. Click [here](#) for an application.

Consular Report of Birth Abroad document fee is now US\$100.

Notarial services now require a US\$50 charge per notary signature.

On June 28, 2010, the Department of State published its Schedule of Fees for Consular Services in the Federal Register. The schedule includes fees for passports, immigrant visas and other consular services. The changes will take effect on July 13, 2010 which is 15 days after publication in the Federal Register. The revised fees will cover actual operating expenses for the 301 overseas consular posts, 23 domestic passport agencies and other centers that provide these consular services to U.S. and foreign citizens.

The 27 adjusted fees are based on a Cost of Service Study completed by the Bureau of Consular Affairs in June 2009. The study, which was the most detailed and exhaustive ever conducted by the Department of State, established the true cost of providing these consular services, which by law must be recovered through collection of fees.
